# **Suffrage in Stitches**

Location: Wellington Museum (on Queens Wharf

When: Friday 7 September – Tuesday 18 September, 10am – 5pm

Cost: Free

Re Sew, Voice Arts and friends will be taking over the Harbour Board Room of the Wellington Museum (under the glassy eyed stare of historical Chair**men** portraits), converting it into a fabulous fabric workshop to rework the suffrage petition. An inclusive project where participants can learn new skills, discuss women's issues, research family connections with the petition, and share stories and experiences.

The temporary installation of the project takes place on the afternoon of September 18<sup>th</sup> 2018, in time for Suffrage 125 the next day. But if you can't make it along to the museum between 7th to 18th September – don't worry you can still get involved as the project runs from 7th September to 27th February 2019.

We're after 546 individual makers to complete a panel each from the petition. The panels can be made using any textiles or paper craft techniques. We're aiming for the final work to be 274 metres long, have 546 individual panels with 25,521 hand stitches; the same length, number of pages and votes as the

original petition. The work will celebrate, through stitch, the lives of the woman who signed the suffrage petition in 1893; as well as the woman known to makers involved in the project.


