Marie-Nui Biss 1934-2020



Sadly another Guild member has died. Marie-Nui Biss, known to most of us simply as Nui, a former Correspondence School teacher and enthusiastic supporter of the Guild. Among other things Nui worked behind the scenes one year to ensure the Guild's continuation by recruiting committee members well before the AGM rolled around. She was President for one year and she was joint co-ordinator with Louise Day of workshops for Conference 2002. Nui was good at seeing what was needed and she instigated The Sherries, a support group for people wishing to undertake a NZ Certificate of Embroidery (ANZEG) although it was not compulsory to do so, and yes, there was a small glass of sherry offered at each monthly Sunday afternoon meeting. The Hedebo Group was set up following the visit of a Danish tutor. The first meeting was held at Nui's home but quickly moved to the Hutt Art Society to accommodate numbers. In 1998 Nui encouraged a group of us to volunteer once a fortnight at the Visual Resource Centre in Kelburn (now

BLENNZ) to make illustrated books and resources for blind and partially sighted children. That group continued for 21 years until the end of last year. In 2000 there was a Teddies for Tragedy project organised by Nui sending knitted teddies to war-torn countries including Mozambique and Laos, transported courtesy of the NZ Army.

Even though Nui and her husband Ralphe moved to New Plymouth in 2007, Nui retained her membership of, and interest in, The Wellington Embroiderers' Guild. I will miss her enthusiasm and support and her excitement at the possibility of seeing her friends.

Valerie Carson 1936 – 2020



Like many other embroiderers, Valerie Carson originally trained as a School Dental Nurse. She was a past President of the Guild and in 1979-80 she went to London to study at the Textile Conservation Centre, then based at Hampton Court Palace. This was the opportunity of a lifetime and Valerie began her second career as a Textile Conservator, first at the National Museum and then Te Papa until she retired 27 years later in 2007. During this time and after her retirement Val took on private textile conservation work covering a wide range of items from historic samplers and christening gowns to All Black jerseys and a Judge's wig.

Another of Val's loves was travel and she led several group tours on the Silk Road and to India. Along the way she assembled an extraordinary collection of textiles from the tiny Uighur cap on her woven willow casket to a deep blue top-

to-toe burga with an embroidered mesh face oval.

As well as being an accomplished and lifelong embroiderer, Valerie was a stylish woman who loved her work with all aspects of embroidery and textiles.

The guild is working on a guild display for Vision 2020. We will base it on the banner we had at the Makers Faire 'We ♥ 2 stitch'



February Meeting

Our February speaker is Kirsty Jackson from CanInspire www.caninspire.org.nz who provide Art Therapy in the form of jewellery making classes to people experiencing illness, trauma or loss. Kirsty spoke passionately about her interest in making jewellery starting in her teenage years. While reluctant at first to get involved she became a convert on attending a workshop run by Sarah Clifford who founded CanInspire 10 years ago, Sarah was given a jewellery kit while she was undergoing treatment for melanoma and made numerous necklaces which she auctioned off making \$3000 for the Cancer Society.

CanInspire provides jewellery classes for a diverse range of groups eg Cancer patients, Skylight Trust, Multiple Sclerosis, Eating Disorders, Women's Refuge and many others, as a form of Art Therapy. What all these groups have in common is the participants have


