Nancys last opening day on Thorndon Quay will be Friday March 26.

It will still be "Nancys" as Sue and Shanon are committed to ensuring Nancy's nearly 54 year legacy is continued and Mary will be involved for a while to ensure a smooth transition.

There are no immediate plans to offer classes.

Marie recommends JK's Cross Stitch Supplies. A new shop who previously sold via a Facebook page. Prices are very reasonable prices for:

- Hand dyed fabrics aida, evenweave, linen, Zweigart
- DMC threads (including cones), GAST, Weeks Dye Works and Threadworx, silks, metallics and speciality threads (Caron, Dinky Dyes, NPI, Gloriana, as well as the popular Sulky 12wt cotton that many people are using (1 thread equivalent to 1.5-2 strands of DMC).
- Kits and patterns.

no looking back. When I was in High School, I managed to get out of making a very ugly skirt by convincing my teacher to let me do tapestry and cross-stitch instead as it was still sewing!

What is your favourite stitch/style of stitching? Anything that will forgive my mistakes, like crewel work and I do like a French knot. I did a "few" of these in my final piece for my City and Guilds Level 1 Hand Embroidery.



Who are your favourite stitch artists/designers and /or books? As much as I love order, I am not good at it. Jean Littlejohn and Jan Beatty are great to make you think about exploring texture in your stitch, using different threads and how to use a simple stitch in different ways.

I love my Inspirations magazines.

What's the best bit of advice you've been given about stitching? During a course with Philippa Turnbull, she said "enjoy your stitching and do not stress about the details – it does not have to be perfect."
