

Hardanger embroidery or "Hardangersøm" is a form of embroidery traditionally worked with white thread on white eve-weave linen or cloth, using counted thread, drawn thread techniques. Contemporarily, it is now even more interesting when different colour threads are used. Want to learn this technique or get some help with something you've started? Barking Mad!

Using a mixture of metal shims (fine, stitchable metal), metal cloths, papers, velvet or felt, stitch and other emellishments create a textured panel based around beautiful patterns of bark.

We will look at domestic and reclaimed metals as well as craft metal shims, learn colouring and manipulation techniques and how to incorporate these materials into your embroidery. The course will allow both machine and hand stitch possibilities depending on your preference.

Tutor Alsyn Midgelow-Marsden Impressive Metals and Fibre Felt.

Create a truly impressive artwork using metal and beads. Learn how to manipulate metal by adding an embossed pattern, colour with alcohol inks and finally use fibres, fabric, stitch and beading techniques to embellish your piece. This day will be hand stitch based. My imagination is going wild with this one....thinking brooches, book covers, as well as framed art....thinking about those competitions!!






Regional Name Change to Tararua
