Kia ora,





## **October Meeting**



Our speaker this month is Kay Coolbear from *Crafting Threads* of *Aroha*. *Crafting Threads of Aroha* is a registered charity that enables the supply of hand crafted and repurposed items to numerous charities and organisations who provide support to people and communities in need. If you would like to contribute something to the charities that they support, you are welcome to bring items to the meeting. Alternatively, Kay will tell us where we can dop off items in the future.

#### **Knitting or crochet**

Baby items in pure wool for boys 6-12 months (vests, jumpers, singlets, cardigans, hats) are the most sought after by the charities we support. Adult and teenage sizes of hats, wrist warmers, slippers and scarves or cowls. Blankets for babies (pure wool) and adults (can be a mix of yarns), knee rugs for cancer patients

Adult socks

#### Sewing

100% cotton quilts (including batting) from cot size up

Children's clothing – track pants and tops, beanies, pyjamas, sizes 7yrs to 18yrs (this can be clean 2<sup>nd</sup> hand clothing) Clothing for toddlers and up to 7 years – overalls, pinafores, track pants, trousers etc

Shopping bags, toiletry bags, backpacks (these can be 2<sup>nd</sup> hand in good order).

Anything that members can provide would be greatly appreciated. If they could attach a label to each item that would be absolutely amazing!

No one will be surprised that she is in the show yet again this year, with a design team that included her husband and son. You will recognize the title Rimurimu as seaweed. We are delighted to be able to support the festival by demonstrating embroidery techniques once again at two venues, Seatoun Village Hall on Sunday 5th November and Old St Pauls. on Sunday 29th October, between 10.00 am and 2.00pm Both events last year were a great success and resulted in us enrolling several new members. Please support the Guild by coming along and demonstrating your favourite technique or by adding a few stitches to the two slate frames that we will have up and running. The frames enticed many beginners to have a go last year, but we always need members to add a few words of encouragement to make the event a success. Please say yes if you are approached to come along, even for an hour or two.

# Conference Project - The Vegetable Garden



We need some more stitchers to help finish our vegetable garden! Thank you to those who have already volunteered and have started. Here are Maria's helpful instructions in case you're just beginning.......

Hello everyone - our Guild piece for exhibition at the Dunedin Conference next year is Vegetable Garden. Like The River we did for the 2018 Conference we are making tiles that will then be put together as a garden. Following is information on our piece:

The blocks are 10 x 10cm - except the centre block and the paths. These are bigger and have more constraints (includes path, hedge etc) on them whereas the 10x10 cm blocks are for vegetables only. You can do more than one vegetable block and you can join them together to make a bigger piece i.e., 2 squares would make a 20\*10 cm vegetable block. You are welcome to sign up for as many blocks as you like including the centre block and paths.

You can use any background fabric you like e.g., canvas, even weave, calico, etc. Please ensure there is a clear 5cm edge of fabric on your piece to assist when putting together. i.e., a 10\*10 cm block would need fabric of 20\*20cm.

The soil colour will give us continuity. When you sign up you will get some threads to use for the soil. If you need more the colours are DMC 3021, 3031, 08, 09, 844.

There is a height limit of 1cm - please remember that we need to get this to Dunedin. Your stitching doesn't have to be just vegetables - there are other plants found in a vegetable garden such as strawberries and herbs - if it grows in a vegetable garden it will be perfect for this project.

# The Vegetable Garden continued

Those doing the centre block plus path blocks - there is fabric and wool to use for the path and hedge respectively. The additional measurements for these blocks are the hedge is 3 cm wide and the path 6cm.

The reason for signing up for these blocks is that we don't have the flexibility of the number of blocks as we did with The River. We need to have all 36 vegetable garden blocks + paths and centre, to make it work. Please add a tag to the back of your piece with name and contact number for when they are returned. I will transfer this information to the individual block.

I would like to see the blocks coming back in **March** please. I need to leave plenty of time to get them all put together. If you want to return them earlier that would be great.

As always - all care will be taken but no responsibility if something happens to your piece.


#### Royal School of Needlework Stitch Bank
