Masterton Retreat 17-18 March

There are a large variety of shisha stitch variations – from the simple to the ornamental. This two hour class will introduce the embroiderer to the fundamental technique for attaching a shisha mirror, coin or shells to fabric.


- Class duration: 2 hours
- Needs List:
- 3 or 4 inch hoop
- Small piece of fabric to fit hoop – woven e.g. cotton, calico (not textured)
- DMC stranded cotton 2 colours (contrasting)
- Needles (Embroidery #7, #8 or #9)
- Embroidery scissors

40 YEARS OF STITCH IN UPPER HUTT


Saturday 22 February – Sunday 4 May

The five Embroiderers' Guilds of the Tararua region have been invited to undertake a commission for the Governor General Hon Dame Cindy Kiro. to embroider handkerchiefs. Wellington Embroiderers' Guild will send 14 embroiderers. We have been asked to keep this project confidential within the Guild.

Dame Cindy will host us at Government House to stitch under Jo Dixey's supervision on, Monday 23 and Tuesday 24 June. Jo is the designer for the project. A good level of surface stitching ability will be required and as the design will be small a good level of eyesight is also required. The morning workshops will begin with morning tea at 9.30am and run until 12.30pm. The afternoon workshops will run from 1pm – 4pm, with a break for afternoon tea. It's possible they may ask for participants to be vetted. That just involves filling out a form and giving permission for vetting to take place.

Please register your interest by Monday 14th April by sending your details to wembroiderersg@gmail.com. Please include your name, email address, phone number and your preferred time to attend. (Mon am, Monday pm, Tuesday am or Tuesday pm) Not everyone will be able to attend if we get more than 14 registrations but don't be disappointed. There will be a wait list and the Guild is applying to Government House to host us all next year to celebrate our 60th Jubilee.
