President's Welcome




Kia ora,

Please register on the website and pay online. Numbers will be limited.


The new work table has been absolutely heavingclearly we all got a lot done while keeping warm all winter!

THEME WORK- FOLK ART




- Sarah made this sampler based on the memories of a family holiday to Fiji in 1971. So simple, but so effective!


Old Saint Paul's Vintage Fair.

The Vintage fair, part of the Wellington Heritage celebrations was a big success. The weather was fine although fierce wind gusts were a bit disruptive. There was a large turn out and sales were great. Thankyou to the team that manned the sales table, including Maria, Lauren, Els and Coralie. Special thanks to all those of you who donated goods for us to sell. Our best sellers were the bunting that we made and the slow stitching packs. We also sold some calendars and a few of the remaining cards. The Christmas decorations also disappeared quickly. Thankyou to all those who helped make the bunting and decorations. They were fabulous.





Meanwhile, inside the stitching tables were busy all day. As the session was interactive with our usual large slate frame and our communal tivaevae, we were talking nonstop about stitching and the Guild. We met so many lovely people. Our first stitcher was here from Sweden to attend a conference. She stitched a small eyelet as she had recently been stitching her regional costume at home which included many eyelets. Many children put in a stitch and the stitcher who stitched for the longest time was on a working holiday from Singapore. Many, many interesting conversations with locals as well.



Short Threads is an exhibition at Katherine Mansfield House that brings together the work of fifteen embroiderers from across Aotearoa New Zealand, each offering a unique stitched interpretation of Mansfield's short stories. Short Threads celebrates Mansfield's enduring influence and the creative dialogue between literature and contemporary textile art.

Our garden party will be the finale to this creative exhibition.
